ACCOMMODATION...

The M/S Brightlingsea has two below-deck saloons, one fitted as a bar, with facilities for drinks, snacks, and meals if arranged in advance.

She is licensed by the Department of Transport to carry 150 passengers, (though this is a bit of a squeeze - we normally recommend a maximum of 90 - 100!) and is subject to stringent annual inspections.

In 1990 a new 'Gardner' engine was installed, (one of the best of maritime engines) and the boat is fitted with radar and a full complement of life saving equipment.

THE M/S 'BRIGHTLINGSEA'

A part of the Nation's Maritime Heritage



In 1925, a motor vessel was built at Rowhedge, near Brightlingsea in Essex for the London and North Eastern Railway, to ply the Harwich, Shotley and Felixstowe waters as a part of the major transport system operated by this great railway company.

Now privately owned, the boat still operates in these waters, not only as a direct link between Harwich and Felixstowe but also offering a unique amenity opportunity for visitors, clubs, cyclists, schools and parties interested in a trip around some of the busiest waters in the country. The fisherman is also catered for with roundyear fishing trips to the choice areas of the rivers Orwell and Stour.

THE SERVICE...

The boat runs regular services between Harwich and Felixstowe and wherever you join, car parking is available (at Felixstowe Dock the park is a six minute walk from the dock). The B.R. railway station at Harwich Town is within easy walking distance of the Ha'Penny Quay where the M/S 'Brightlingsea' is based, whilst there is an Eastern Counties bus service between the Town and the dock at Felixstowe.

A regular timetable is run during the Summer season, but there is scope for other services. These have included trips to and from Ipswich, also to follow the annual barge race, and to link up with the P.S. 'Waverley'. Private bookings for parties and celebrations of all sorts are arranged in or out of the season.

A popular feature with schools for many years has been 'educational' trips which bring to pupils the scale of maritime work in the area, whilst fishermen delight in a relaxing opportunity for a special trip with rod and line.

HISTORIC HARWICH...

Whilst in Harwich, don't forget the attractions of this historic old town. The enormous Redoubt fort, built in 1810 and splendidly restored, the old lighthouses and Maritime Museum, the early 19th Century church, the 1910 'Electric Palace' cinema and the Guildhall. Many eating houses and pubs provide food and drink to suit all tastes and pockets, whilst above all there is a constant kaleidoscope of shipping, from the greatest to the smallest, visible from the quay and the promenade.
